Clinician

Position summary: Clinician will work in an outpatient opioid use disorder program completing behavioral health assessments to make determinations about treatment needs. Clinician will provide the clinical services such as treatment planning, individual counseling and group counseling for the program. Clinician will collaborate with prescribers and other team members to develop and implement treatment and intervention programs that are client-centered and collaborative. Additionally, clinician will work with client, family and treatment team to create discharge plans and link to follow up care.

Duties and Responsibilities: Clinician will provide assessment/evaluation services to determine appropriate level of care. The clinician will provide on-going assessment, treatment planning and interventions and discharge planning to clients admitted to care. Clinician may provide individual, group and family therapy and will collaborate with various referral agencies including treatment providers, courts and hospitals, as well as with opioid treatment providers (OTPs) and Narcotics Treatment Programs (NTPs), as needed. Other pertinent or weekly duties may include:

- Completing authorizations for services provided through the electronic health record
- Documenting assessment and assessment outcomes, treatment interventions and treatment progress
- Developing discharge plans and linking to follow up care
- Completing discharge paperwork for clients discharged from services

Minimum Qualifications:

Candidate must have at least a Master’s Degree from an accredited educational institution in Psychology, Social Work, or Community Counseling AND LMSW, LMFT, LPC LCSW or PsyD status (or licensed eligible) in the state of Georgia.

Preferred Qualifications:

Individuals with experience in Addictive Diseases, primarily Opioid Use Disorder and Medication Assisted Treatment; individuals with at least 2 years of related experience and/or training in behavioral health, working with clients and families, case management or community/in-home based services; experience with administering Individual Service Plans (ISPs)/treatment plans; and familiarity with clinical terminology.
